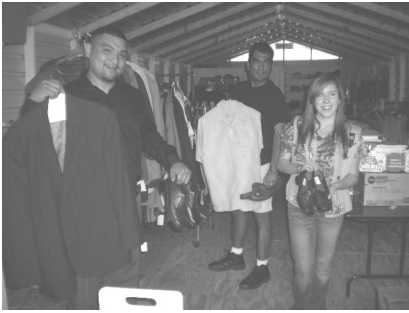


We are so pleased to finally have an on-site clothes closet to serve the needs of our BCDM Family Renewal Center clients.

Make sure you have:

- clean and polished conservative dress shoes

- no gum, candy, smoking cigarettes, or other objects in your mouth
- minimal jewelry
- cover tattoos

Tips for an INTERVIEW *

Preparation:

- Learn about the organization/company.
- Have a specific job or jobs in mind.
- Review your qualifications for the job.
- Be ready to briefly describe your experience
- Practice an interview with a friend or relative.

The interview:

- greet him or her with a firm handshake.
- Use good manners with everyone you meet.
- Relax and answer each question concisely.
- Use proper English—avoid slang.
- Be cooperative and enthusiastic.
- Use body language to show interest.
- Ask questions about the position and the organization.
- Thank the interviewer when you leave and shake hands.
- Send a short thank you note following the interview.

Information to bring to an interview:

- Social Security card.
- Government-issued identification.
- Resume or application.
- References.
- Transcripts.
- Letter of Recommendation.

Clients will need an internal referral from assigned case manager.
